

## LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE – Ray Allee, Chair



### HALL JOHNSON LANDSCAPING

Several homeowners have questioned why the HOA has not planted landscaping along the entire perimeter wall on Hall Johnson. The area along the Hall Johnson wall from the Whitehaven intersection going West to the end of the wall past the Highland Meadows intersection has proven a landscaping challenge for several years. We've tried a variety of plants along the wall, with very little success. We've also consulted with several arborists to get a better understanding of the problem – allelopathy – which prohibits growth of most plants in the areas under the live oak trees.

Live oaks produce chemicals that prevent other plants from growing near them, an adaptation called allelopathy. Allelopathy is the production of plant inhibiting chemicals by one plant to regulate the growth of others. One group of chemicals produced by live oaks is tannins. They are produced by the leaves and by root systems in the soil. Tannins are inhibitors to other plants. Salicylic acids and other organic acids are also produced by live oaks and are toxic to other plants. The chemicals are stored within the live oak leaves. As leaves drop to the ground the plants absorb the toxic chemicals and die.

The roots of the live oak tend to be in the upper 12 inches of the soil and form a mat that is discouraging to other plant roots by robbing the plants of moisture. Live oak trees also use allelopathy to protect their space by using their roots to pull more water from the soil so that other plants cannot survive. Toxins are also released through the roots, which are absorbed by other plants. All of this contributes to the failure of plants to thrive under the live oak trees along Hall Johnson.

We will continue to monitor the area, and plant landscaping where the Live Oaks and Red Oaks will not overhang our landscaping beds. Please be patient with us as we work through this challenge. Our end goal is to have landscaping along Hall Johnson that everyone in our community will be proud of.

Through the years they have been challenged by the amount of sand in their landscape as the land was previously used for farming, so finding the right flowers and plants to survive has been fun. Just like many of our neighbors in HMOA, the Przano's have experimented with different foliage that best suits the mix of sun and shade. They have landed on Begonias as a key feature of the landscape accented with Japanese Arailia and Boston Ivy as ground cover. Unfortunately, disease struck two of their Crepe Myrtles and had to be cut down, but were replaced with Rose of Sharon. Aside from their beautiful front yard, Dawan and Anthony enjoy gardening and planting flowers in the back yard as well. They are currently growing onions, asparagus, garlic, tomatoes, chives, many herbs and watermelons. In the past, they've had potatoes, pumpkins and jalapenos. Some of Dawan's favorite flowers featured around the house are Calla Lillies, Hydrangea's, Tiger Lillies, Impatiens, Jack Bean and Hosta. Congrats again to Dawan and Anthony! ### **EXTERNAL & ARCHITECTURAL MODIFICATIONS TO YOUR HOME & PROPERTY**

**ACC REMINDER** We can't say it enough - **Please be sure to file for ACC approval before you undertake projects on your property.** We've had several homeowners who began modifications without ACC approval, or submitted an ACC application with incomplete data, and it has delayed their project. **THE ACC HAS 15 DAYS TO REVIEW YOUR APPLICATION. We normally can approve your request sooner, but it may take up to 15 days, especially if we need more information from the homeowner.**



Not sure if you need ACC approval? Contact CMA to verify before you begin work on your project... Customer Care: 972-943-2828 or MidCities Office: 817-310-6900. The approved list of roofing materials is found on page 8.

### **ARCHITECTURAL FAQ'S**

#### **What projects need approval?**

Any modifications or alterations to the exterior of your property. Submission for approval is always recommended.

#### **Do I have to wait to start the project?**

Yes, all projects must be submitted and approved prior to starting.

**What if I did not obtain approval for my project?** You will be asked to submit for approval. If your project is denied, you may be required to remove your project and restore the property to the previous condition.

#### **My contractor does not provide drawings or brochures. What should I use instead?**

A hand drawing of the project will be sufficient as long as it includes a plat map, dimensions, colors and materials.

#### **If my project will not change from the original design, location, color or dimension, do I need to submit to the Committee?**

Yes, please reach out to CMA or the ACC. We can let you know if ACC approval is needed or not.

#### **Where can I obtain an ACC form?**

You may submit your ACC request online. Log in at [www.cmamanagement.com](http://www.cmamanagement.com), and click on "ACC Request" in the Homeowner Toolbox." If you do not have a computer in order to submit your ACC request online, please contact CMA to obtain a paper form.

#### **How will I be notified of the Committee's decision?**

You will be notified by first class mail of the Committee's decision.

### **Bennett's Flag Service | 2022**

Hello, my name is Bennett Weitzer. As you know, I recently purchased Dylan Wade's Flag Service in order to keep the neighborhood tradition going. I will continue the program, without any changes by putting up American Flag(s) in your yard, at the curbside or other location by special request on the five U.S Holidays. The 2022 dates for install/removal are as follows (subject to adjust, weather permitting or concerning conditions):

- Memorial Day (5/27-5/30)
- Flag Day (6/10-6/15)
- Independence Day (7/1-7/5)
- Labor Day (9/2-9/6)
- Veterans Day (11/10-11/14)

The same 3 foot by 5 foot American flag will be hung on a 10 foot high metal pole and will be installed/removed, just as before.

As a gentle reminder, this is a annual, lease service offering and the flags and tools are property of the business (\*The \$50.00 is for the service, not purchasing a flag, pole or any accessories). I will store the flags after the annual year is complete and see you again next year!

Annual flag lease service is \$50.00 and covers all five of the American Holidays stated above.


